***Did you know:*** One of Köchert's most famous pieces were the stars of Empress Elisabeth. As the family lost their empire, all of the stars (as well as other notable pieces) were sold. When possible, A.E. Köchert buys back these pieces and then loans them back to the former Royal family!!
